
MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN OUR COMMUNITIES

The Activities Committee

- Established around 2010 when the Grand Lodge Consolidated the Committees to save money and increase community presence
- Each Lodge is required to have an Activities Committee (Statute 13.021)
- Charged with Implementing:
 - Public Relations, Hoop Shoot, and Drug Awareness Programs of the Lodge, State, and Grand Lodge
 - Supervising all matters pertaining to activities of a civic, social, and community interest, including one Elks Sponsored Community Project
 - Responsible for community outreach and involvement through youth activities and community projects.

Funding of Community Projects

Elks National Foundation Community Investment Grants

Impact Grants
\$10,000 dollars (Competitive major projects)

Beacon Grants \$3,500 dollars (Ongoing Elk projects)

▶ **Gratitude Grants** \$3,000 dollars (mast reach ENF Per-Capita)

Promise Grants \$2,500 dollars for Youth (first 500 applicants)

Freedom Grants \$2,500 dollars for Veterans (first 300 applicants)

Spotlight Grants
\$2,000 dollars for pre-selected projects

- A simple yet effective program
- Recognizes First Responders
 - ▶ Law Enforcement
 - Firefighters
 - ► EMS Providers
- Cost of the medals are only \$9.00 dollars each (plus S/H)
- Can be ordered through the Lodge Secretary

BEYOND THE CALL OF DUTY




Scouting Program

- Host Eagle Scout Courts of Honor
- Partner with Scouts to do a joint Community Service Project



Marvin M. Lewis Award

- Named after the 1982 Past Grand Exalted Ruler Marvin M. Lewis
- To Recognize Elks who are involved in working with the Boy Scouts of America
- Every Lodge can submit one nominee each year
- Winners are recognized at the Grand Lodge Session each year.



Marvin M. Lewis Award Recognizes Elks Engaged in

- Forming Scouting Units—Especially those involving Elk Lodges
- Recruiting Elk Members to become Scout Leaders and to be involved in units operated by Elks
- Take Scouter Training and set a god example for youth
- Promote Scouting for all youth, regardless of race, creed, or disabling condition
- No specific length of service is required.
- A person's accomplishments and dedication weigh more heavily than longevity




Competition is divided into Gender/Age Groups



5-Goal Contest











Grid Goal & Points




Soccer Shoot Regions


The Antlers Program
